(F) CONSENT AGENDA

(F-1) BOC - Resolution Relating to Second Amendment Rights (Tabled from April)

The Board of Commissioners reviewed a resolution adopted by Beaufort County, NC at the March 4, 2013 work session. Resulting from the work session discussion, the Commission requested the county attorney aid in drafting a statement supporting Second Amendment rights. This item was tabled from the April work session to May.

UPON MOTION of Commissioner Burrage, seconded by Vice Chairman White and unanimously carried, the Board approved the following resolution:

Resolution No. 2013-07

RESOLUTION OF THE CABARRUS COUNTY
BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS RELATING TO THE
RIGHTS AND PROTECTIONS OF THE SECOND AMENDMENT
TO THE UNITED STATES CONSTITUTION AND
ARTICLE I, SECTION 30 OF THE NORTH CAROLINA CONSTITUTION

WHEREAS, the Second Amendment to the Constitution of the United States provides as follows:

A well regulated militia, being necessary to the security of a free state, the right of the people to keep and bear arms shall not be infringed.

WHEREAS, Article I, Section 30 of the North Carolina Constitution provides as follows:

A well regulated militia being necessary to the security of a free State, the right of the people to keep and bear arms shall not be infringed; and, as standing armies in time of peace are dangerous to liberty, they shall not be maintained, and the military shall be kept under strict subordination to, and governed by, the civil power. Nothing herein shall justify the practice of carrying concealed weapons, or prevent the General Assembly from enacting penal statutes against that practice.

WHEREAS, the President and Vice-President of the United States and/or members of Congress are reportedly considering adopting laws, rules, regulations or executive actions which could have the effect of infringing on the rights of citizens of the State of North Carolina and Cabarrus County to keep and bear arms as provided in the Second Amendment and Article I, Section 30.

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of Cabarrus County are concerned that such actions could infringe on such rights of the citizens of this County and of North Carolina and the United States generally.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Cabarrus County Board of Commissioners supports in full measure the rights and protections of the Second Amendment to the United States Constitution and Article I, Section 30 of the North Carolina Constitution.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that neither the President nor Congress nor the General Assembly of North Carolina pass any law, rule, regulation or other executive or legal action to abridge or modify the Second Amendment or Article I, Section 30, except in such manner as to clarify and fortify the rights and protections of those constitutional provisions.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this resolution be transmitted to the respective clerks of the two chambers of the General Assembly and to each member thereof, as well as to the Governor, the chair of the county commissioners of the other North Carolina counties, the North Carolina Association of County Commissioners and the general public.

(F-2) County Manager - Approval of Salary of the Newly Appointed Board of Elections Director per NCGS 163-35 (c)

Linda Grist, Elections Director, will be retiring, effective June 30, 2013. Pursuant to NCGS 163-35 (a), in the event of a vacancy, the County Board of Elections shall submit a recommendation to the Executive Director of the State Board of Elections, who shall issue a letter of appointment to the selected candidate. The appointment letter was received April 18, 2013,

approving Ms. Carol Link Soles as the new Elections Director, effective July 1, 2013. The Board of Elections has offered a starting salary of \$56,681.81 per NCGS 163-35(c).

UPON MOTION of Commissioner Burrage, seconded by Vice Chairman White and unanimously carried, the Board approved the starting salary of appointed Board of Elections Director, Carol Link Soles, effective July 1, 2013 for the amount of \$56,681.81 as authorized by NCGS 163-35(c).

(F-3) County Manager - Cabarrus-Rowan Metropolitan Planning Organization Memorandum of Understanding

The Cabarrus-Rowan Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) has updated the Memorandum of Understanding for member governments of the regional group. It has been recommended for approval by both the elected level committee (Transportation Advisory Committee) and staff level committee (Technical Coordinating Committee).

UPON MOTION of Commissioner Burrage, seconded by Vice Chairman White and unanimously carried, the Board approved the Cabarrus-Rowan MPO Memorandum of Understanding and authorized the Chair of the Board of Commissioners to execute the agreement.

(F-4) County Manager - Convert Board-Approved Leave Share Policy to an Administrative Policy

On January 18, 1994, the Board approved the last revision to the Leave Share Policy (a policy that allows employees to donate vacation time to a bank where employees in need can receive extended sick leave based on criteria tied to an extended medical condition). This policy is administrative in nature and needs flexibility for modification as operational changes occur. It would be beneficial to management if this policy were converted from a Board-approved policy to an administrative policy, subject to change at the county managers' discretion.

UPON MOTION of Commissioner Burrage, seconded by Vice Chairman White and unanimously carried, the Board approved changing the Leave Share Policy from a Board-approved policy to an administrative policy.

(F-5) County Manager - NCDOT Request for Design/Construction Agreement Resolution

The Division 10 Staff of the North Carolina Department of Transportation (NCDOT) have requested a resolution from the Board of Commissioners requesting a design and construction agreement for the extension of Raging Ridge Road and the construction of a new bridge. The resolution outlines basic terms for design responsibility, construction oversight and project funding.

UPON MOTION of Commissioner Burrage, seconded by Vice Chairman White and unanimously carried, the Board adopted the following resolution:

RESOLUTION REQUESTING NCDOT TO ENTER AN AGREEMENT
CONCERNING THE RAGING RIDGE ROAD AND BRIDGE PROJECT

WHEREAS, the Cabarrus County Board of Commissioners wish to improve ingress and egress from Hickory Ridge High and Middle Schools; and

WHEREAS, the Cabarrus County Board of Commissioners and Board of Education previously indicated support for the Raging Ridge Road extension and bridge project, and requested N.C. Department of Transportation assistance; and

WHEREAS, the N.C. Department of Transportation has committed to assistance through the Division office and discretionary money approved by the Legislature, and Cabarrus County has committed to provide funding for the remainder of the project; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners would like for this project to move forward as expeditiously and efficiently as possible.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Cabarrus County Board of Commissioners by this resolution, hereby asks the N.C. Department of Transportation to enter into an agreement with Cabarrus County to complete design, oversee construction and jointly fund the Raging Ridge Road and bridge project.

Funding includes \$250,000 from the Division 10 office, and up to \$250,000 from N.C. General Assembly discretionary funds. Cabarrus County agrees to fund the remainder of the project including any discretionary money shortfall, up to \$125,000, for the project.

(F-6) County Manager - NCDOT Request for Purchase of Construction Easement

The N.C. Department of Transportation has requested to purchase a temporary construction easement on the north/northwest side of the Rocky River Elementary School property as part of the double track rail project around Harrisburg. The purchase request is for less than a tenth of an acre. The standard practice of the Board has been to approve a budget amendment that allows the proceeds of the sale to benefit the affected school. This item has been sent to Board of Education staff for their review and approval.

(F-7) Emergency Management - Transfer of Surplus Vehicle to Odell Volunteer Fire and Rescue Department

The second phase of the Porter Farm Grant was inadvertently placed in the General Fund Budget versus the Special Projects Fund. It is requested, for accounting and tracking purposes, to place the second phase with along with the first phase.

Additionally, it is requested to transfer a matching portion of the Clark Creek Grant from the General Fund to the Special Projects Fund, in order to keep associated grant expenditures with the grant for accounting and tracking purposes.

Neither request increases the grant funding nor the County's match.

CABARRUS COUNTY SMALL PROJECTS
CAPITAL PROJECT ORDINANCE

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Cabarrus, North Carolina that, pursuant to Section 13.2 of Chapter 159 of the General Statutes of North Carolina, the following capital project ordinance is hereby adopted:

Section 1. The project authorized is for the purpose of collecting and appropriating general fund revenues and federal and state grants funds received specifically for use by the appropriate Cabarrus County Department who has received the funds.

Section 2. The officers of this unit are hereby directed to proceed with this project within the terms of the guidelines as set forth by the federal and state government, Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP) and the budget contained herein.

Section 5. The Finance Officer is hereby directed to maintain within the Capital Projects Fund sufficient detailed accounting records.

Section 6. Funds may be advanced from the General Fund for the purpose of making payments as due. Reimbursement to the General Fund should be made in an orderly and timely manner.

Section 7. The Finance Officer is directed to report, at the request of the Board, on the financial status of each project element in Section 4 and on the total revenues received or claimed.

Section 8. Copies of this capital project ordinance shall be furnished to the Clerk to the Governing Board, and to the Budget Officer and the Finance Officer for direction in carrying out this project.

Section 9. At the completion of the project, all unrestricted excess funds are transferred to the General Fund and the Capital Project Ordinance is closed.

Section 10. The County Manager is hereby authorized to transfer revenues and appropriation within an ordinance as contained herein under the following conditions:

- a. The Manager may transfer amounts between objects of expenditures and revenues within a function without limitation.
- b. The Manager may transfer amounts up to \$100,000 between functions of the same ordinance.
- c. The Manager may transfer amounts between contingency funds which are set aside for a specific project for budgetary shortfalls or upon the appropriate approval of a change order.
- d. Upon notification of funding increases or decreases to existing grants or revenues or the award of grants or revenues, the Manager or Finance Officer may adjust budgets to match, including grants that require a County match for which funds are available.
- e. The Manager may enter into and execute change orders or amendments to County construction contracts in amounts up to \$90,000 when the project ordinance contains sufficient appropriated but unencumbered funds.

(F-10) General Services - Cabarrus County Construction and Demolition Landfill - Proposed Public/Private Compost Operation

Staff presented information at the work session on the proposed public/private compost operation as well as a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between Cabarrus County and Agromatters, LLC, as it relates to the creation of a public/private compost operation at the Cabarrus County Construction and Demolition Landfill.

UPON MOTION of Commissioner Burrage, seconded by Vice Chairman White and unanimously carried, the Board approved a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between Cabarrus County and Argomatters, LLC, as it relates specifically to the Irish Potato Road C&D Landfill, subject to review and/or revision by the County Attorney.

(F-11) Planning and Development - Soil and Water Conservation District - Approval of Amendments to North Carolina Clean Water Management Trust Fund Contract

Amendment No. 4 and Amendment No. 5 to the North Carolina Clean Water Management Trust Fund Contract have been drafted to incorporate adjustments necessary to close out the design and construction phases and continue implementing the educational and water quality monitoring phases. No new county funding is associated with these amendments.

UPON MOTION of Commissioner Burrage, seconded by Vice Chairman White and unanimously carried, the Board approved the amended contract.

(F-12) Planning and Development - Soil and Water Conservation District - Proposed Terms for a Stream Restoration Project on Back Creek

The Cabarrus Soil and Water Conservation District (CSWCD) Board and Mogensen Mitigation, Inc. have an agreement whereby CSWCD will identify potential sites for stream restoration and wetland mitigation projects, provide technical assistance and hold conservation easements associated with completed projects. CSWCD has identified a potential project on Back Creek in Harrisburg that includes the stream buffer on the campuses of Hickory Ridge Middle School and Hickory Ridge High School owned by Cabarrus County and the Cabarrus County Board of Education, respectively. CSWCD will submit a proposed project budget to the Board of Commissioners for approval if the project further materializes.

UPON MOTION of Commissioner Burrage, seconded by Vice Chairman White and unanimously carried, the Board approved the proposed terms for a stream restoration project on Back Creek between Cabarrus County and Mogensen Mitigation, Inc.

Section 11, Public and Private Roads

11. Existing 45 Foot Right-Of- Way

Where a 45 foot right-of-way exists and lot access cannot be gained from a state maintained right-of-way, up to 20 lots may use the existing right-of-way to access a public street. Increasing the length of the existing right-of-way to accommodate new lots is not permitted.

For additional lots to access the existing 45 foot private right-of-way, the following shall apply:

- a. The travel way must be at least 12 feet wide with gravel four inches deep. In addition, the first 25 feet of the road must be 18 feet wide and paved when the private road adjoins a paved road.
- b. Vehicle turnarounds must be provided at the end of all dead end roads.
- c. The subdivider is responsible for obtaining a permit for access to a state maintained road.
- d. A right-of-way maintenance agreement that includes all parties that use the right-of-way must be recorded in the office of the Register of Deeds to ensure proper maintenance. In the event a right-of-way maintenance agreement is already recorded, said document shall be amended to include new lots and property owners to the Agreement. A copy of this

agreement shall be provided to the Planning Department prior to recording and to any approvals being issued for the proposed subdivision.

12. Private Roads and Streets

New roads or streets with 5 or more lots may be permanently designated as a private road or street. These roads or streets, however, shall be built to the North Carolina Department of Transportation public standard for the appropriate type of road or street. Additionally, a Road Maintenance Agreement shall be recorded in the office of the Register of Deeds to ensure that proper maintenance of the private road is provided by property owners gaining access from the road or street.

(G-4) County Manager - Presentation of the Proposed FY2014 Cabarrus County Budget and Scheduling of a Public Hearing

Mike Downs, County Manager, presented the following budget message to the Board:

Honorable Chairman and Members of the Cabarrus County Board of Commissioners,

I am excited to submit to you the recommended Cabarrus County Operating Budget for fiscal year 2014. This budget was prepared in accordance with the General Statutes of North Carolina and the Local Budget Fiscal Control Act. The Board's established mission, vision and strategic goals provided valuable structure and guidance in the preparation of this balanced budget. Included in this comprehensive document are the expected revenue projections and proposed operational expenses for the 2014 fiscal year.

Beginning in November 2012, all levels of staff worked together to implement a 360 degree review of the relevancy, effectiveness and efficiency of Cabarrus County programs and services. This included research, evaluation and consideration of changes in staffing levels, consolidation of departments' programs and/or services, and privatization of services--some of which are included in the proposed budget. At the core of this budget is a balance of needs with modest adjustments to operations that will move Cabarrus forward in the best interest of our residents.

I recommend a General Fund Budget of \$212,940,116. This is a proposed 2.55 percent increase in spending over the FY2013 amended budget. To fund this budget as proposed will require the Board of Commissioners to adopt an ad valorem tax rate of 70 cents. The proposed budget maintains existing levels of spending in most departments and allows for some growth in areas with increased service demands, especially law enforcement and human services, in order to meet the current and future needs of Cabarrus County residents.

The proposed FY2014 budget revenue projections are based on the current economic reality and economic forecasts, which indicate positive signs of growth in coming years.

Economic and Operational Impacts on County Budget

1. Due to positive economic growth, we expect a 2.55 percent increase in revenues for FY 2014.
2. During the Board of Commissioners' retreat in February, Professor John Chesser shared current trends and projections of expected growth in our County and throughout the region. He magnified the importance of preparing for the impact of growth--an increased need for public services.
3. Cabarrus County has experienced an increase in both commercial and residential growth over the last year. Increased activity in our Register of Deeds and Construction Standards departments supports theories of continued growth in building and, potentially, population during the next year.
4. Cabarrus County's unemployment rate is currently decreasing and on May 1, was at 8.3 percent. The decrease is encouraging; however, we need to continue to research and create economic opportunities that will further lower unemployment in the coming year.
5. Fuel and energy costs have increased, which will continue to affect the County's operating budget.
6. The Federal Sequestration can potentially affect federal funding levels for mandated services within the Human Services department. We predict the reduction in federal funds will require an increase in County funding to maintain current service levels.
7. The financial impact of federal health care and state Medicaid reform is unknown at this point. However, increased eligibility in both programs has the potential to strain already maximized workloads and service levels within our Human Services department.
8. Enrollment in Cabarrus County and Kannapolis City school systems continues to grow and more students are considering post-secondary education opportunities through Rowan-Cabarrus Community College. To meet the increased demand on resources, both public school systems and the community college prioritize capital projects as an imminent need.
9. Surrounding counties are adding staff in order to meet the demands of an improving economy. This puts Cabarrus in competition to recruit and retain employees with the specialized experience necessary to provide high-quality services.

We have carefully weighed the aforementioned factors and considered their impact on programs, services, staff and productivity. The proposed budget ensures staffing levels and expenditures will address increased workloads, offer market-competitive salaries to our employees, and meet the needs and expectations of our residents.

To create balance, the proposed budget includes some revisions to County operations.

FY2014 Budget Highlights

1. As Cabarrus grows, our staff continuously and diligently implements new and innovative strategies to maximize outcomes. Sometimes, this means the realignment and restructure of positions to meet the County's operational needs. Just as we did in FY2013, the County has combined assignments to create full-time positions that more-appropriately meet future demands of particular programs and services.
2. Cognizant of future County senior-level management needs, I propose creating assistant director positions within the General Services and Human Services departments; areas accountable for critical incident response. Adding personnel will increase oversight and reduce the disproportionate responsibilities that currently fall to the department directors. The assistant director will take responsibility for a large portion of daily operation management within each department, allowing the director to concentrate on overarching policy and customer service strategies. These positions will also assist the County in meeting the Board's succession planning goals.
3. The consolidation of our human service-related departments (DSS, Transportation and Aging Services) will become effective July 1. The proposed budget includes the addition of several new positions to address current and future challenges with oversight and workload within the department.
4. Additional staff for the Sheriff's department is also included in the budget proposal. The additions will address public safety concerns identified by the Sheriff and the recent staffing study. These new positions will allow the Sheriff to move toward a civilian 911 emergency communications division and reassign more sworn officers to the department's patrol division. It adds a clerical position to process increased demands in gun/concealed weapon permits and works in partnership with the Town of Midland to add four patrol officers to that area of the County.
5. The budget recommendation includes a 1.5 percent Cost-of-Living Adjustment (COLA) and reinstatement of performance-based merit increases, per the Board of Commissioners' policies. The proposal also includes funds to perform a market/position study that will compare County salaries against competitive salaries for organizations in our region and state. This is a necessity as we strive to keep our valued employees and recruit quality future employees.
6. Additional school funding for capital- and energy-related needs are included in the FY2014 budget proposal.
7. An increased number of claims have again put a strain on the County's Employee Health Plan is this year. The result was a potential cost increase for FY2014 that experts projected would exceed 18 percent. Based on plan design changes approved by the Board of Commissioners in March for implementation in FY2014, we now project the County will experience only a 7.5 percent increase in health plan costs.

Cabarrus County's economy is trending in a positive direction, bringing with it an increased number of residents to whom the County provides services. To address this steady climb, we must identify and prepare for school capital and maintenance needs, and increased demands on our public safety and human service providers. The proposed FY2014 budget meets these top priorities with balance. It streamlines operations and works within a financially responsible business model to sustain and build upon the high-level of service residents of Cabarrus County have grown to expect from their local government.

In closing, I would like to recognize staff at all levels of our County government for their commitment to maintain and improve on the programs and services we provide. They have risen to the challenge of doing more with less during multiple years of economic uncertainty. I encourage the residents of Cabarrus to join me and show their appreciation for each one of them. It is through their hard work and dedication that we are able to make the vision of the Board a reality.

I especially want to publically thank Ann Wilson, finance director; Paarth Mehta, budget analyst; Becky Crabtree,

accountant; Lundee Covington, human resource director; and our deputy county managers, Pam Dubois and Jonathan Marshall, for their long hours and hard work in preparation of this budget. I also want to express my appreciation to the Board of Commissioners for their support and leadership during the budget process and throughout the year.

Mr. Downs announced the Board received the FY 2014 budget on flash/thumb drives this evening.

Chairman Poole announced the proposed FY 2014 budget will be filed in the office of the Clerk to the Board at the Cabarrus County Governmental Center during regular business hours. The 2014 preliminary budget will also be posted on the County's website at www.cabarruscounty.us. Budget meetings will be held May 28, 29, and 30, 2013 at 4:00 p.m. in the Multipurpose Room at the Governmental Center and the meetings are open to the public. She also stated there will be presentations from any entities and departments funded by Cabarrus County and a public hearing will be held for the proposed budget on June 17th.

UPON MOTION of Commissioner Burrage, seconded by Commissioner Measmer and unanimously carried, the Board scheduled a public hearing on the proposed FY 2014 Cabarrus County Budget for Monday, June 17, 2013 at 6:30 p.m. or as soon thereafter as persons may be heard.

Appointments and removals are needed for the Council for a Sustainable Local Economy (CSLE.). Robin Pope has submitted an application to serve on the Council for a Sustainable Local Economy.

Rod Townley and Lori Clay have submitted their resignations from the Council effective May 1, 2013. Both members have served the Council since its creation in April of 2011.

UPON MOTION of Commissioner Burrage, seconded by Vice Chairman White and unanimously carried, the Board appointed Robin Pope to the Council for a Sustainable Local Economy (CSLE) to complete an unexpired term ending December 31, 2013 and an additional one-year term ending December 31, 2014.

UPON MOTION of Commissioner Burrage, seconded by Vice Chairman White and unanimously carried, the Board removed Rod Townley and Lori Clay from the Council for a Sustainable Local Economy roster effective May 1, 2013 and thanked them for their many years of service.

(H-2) Appointments - Adult Care Home Community Advisory Committee

Cynthia Brooks and Paula Brandle have submitted applications to serve on the Adult Care Home Community Advisory Committee. Both applicants have been prequalified by Laurie Abounader, Regional Ombudsman.

Ed Burns' term on the Adult Care Home Community Advisory Committee ends May 31st. He is willing to serve another term.

There are six (6) vacant positions on this Board.

UPON MOTION of Vice Chairman White, seconded by Commissioner Burrage and unanimously carried, the Board appointed Cynthia Brooks and Paula Brandle to the Adult Care Home Community Advisory Committee for one-year terms ending May 31, 2014.

UPON MOTION of Vice Chairman White, seconded by Commissioner Burrage and unanimously carried, the Board reappointed Ed Burns to the Adult Care Home Community Advisory Committee for a three-year term ending May 31, 2016.


